1. Academic Activities

Below is a summary of academic activities in the school since we resumed:

- Extra support lessons continued for students with academic challenges. The Vice-Principal has been giving parents of such students updated.
- Supervision of teachers in the classroom intensified to ensure they are adhering to agreed upon the checklist for teaching and learning in the classroom.
- Application of real-life application to theoretical concepts by teachers in the classroom still been monitored and implemented.
- SS3 students registered for JAMB and WAEC examinations.
- MOCK examination for SS3 students conducted and completed.
 Cambridge IGCSE exam registration also completed for students who registered for the exam. (It is not compulsory for all SS3)
- Centralized tests conducted and completed for JSS1-SS2 students.
- Teachers enrolled for Cambridge IGCSE online training.

- Cambridge and WAEC Examinations concluded for SS3 students
- Saturday Maths clinic continued.
- Early morning Cambridge lessons for SS2 students continued.
- The office of the Academic Adviser organized the following programmes: 'Re-learn to Read' reading programme for some students; Followed through with some SS1 transfer science students who were struggling in First term; Group counseling sessions for both career and academics conducted; Inauguration of career counselor assistants/students career counselor for JSS3 students.

2. Extra-curricular Activities

In New Horizons College Minna, we try to give as much emphasis to extracurricular activities as we give to academic activities, all in a bid to provide a holistic education to each child as they pass through the 6-years of the NHC experience! Below are some of the extracurricular activities for this term:

- Personal Development and Leadership training conducted for SS3 students thrice since they resumed this term.
- The school came first in the drama, painting and singing competition of the HIEFEST competition in art and culture for secondary schools in Niger state. The school won the prize for the Best-Behaved School during the competition. Lastly, the school placed third in the "On-spot" Non-fiction writing competition.
- The Students Affairs Department of the school has continued to engage students on academic and non-academic affairs. Some of these include: collaboration with class teachers in dealing with issues as they affect the students; preliminary investigation of disciplinary cases; Posters making, Friday Prayers coordination, vetting of books and other social affairs to be presented, organization of class meetings, One-on-One counseling sessions, organization of class meetings, etc.
- AskDIN, a student's question and answer enlightenment session on various topics in Islam was held. Over thirty questions complied from the students were answered by brother Nuruddeen Lemu of the Islamic Education Trust.
- Educational visit by SS2 Chemistry students to Science Equipment Development Institute (SEDI) in Minna
- ICT club members attended the "Google Developers Festival Conference."
- Our students placed First in the Aisha Lemu Quiz competition and Second position in exhibition category of the competition.

3. Islamiyyah Update

Alhamdulillah, we are beginning to see visible progress and improvement in the teaching and learning during the school's Islamiyyah classes. Below are Islamiyyah activities recorded this term:

- Self-improvement recitation and memorization programme continued after subhi and before maghrib prayers.
- First ten minutes in Tahfeez lesson is used for revision, before the start of normal lesson every day.
- Islamiyyah quiz was introduced to assess and give students a better understanding of the knowledge of tajweed.
- . Intra-class competition was organized across all classes.
- Tajweed class have continued to witness progress and improvement, by employing or engaging in more practicals than theoretical concepts during normal Islamiyyah lessons.

4. Hostel Information

The school has been organizing craft activities for students for a while. Some students usually buy materials used for crafts from their pocket money account. Since materials are a bit more expensive and deducting from the account will deplete their pocket money quickly, we are giving the students the option to pay for the materials separately by bringing the money when they resume, or they can buy the materials at home and bring them to school.

Some of the craft activities will hold in 2nd and some in 3rd term in sha Allah.

The craft activities they can chose from are: (They can pick one or all. Please check the ones you want them to participate in)

3.	DIY Design and Printing - Mug Personalization: 6k
4.	DIY Design and Printing - Fabric (T-shirt, throw pillow cover and
draws	string): 6k
5.	Paper Craft; box making and notepads: 6k
